I am an Assistant Professor of International Business at the University of Dhaka, Bangladesh. I hold a PhD in Applied Economics from South China University of Technology, China, where my doctoral research examined the impact of cultural distance on international trade disputes. I also earned both my MBA and BBA in International Business from the University of Dhaka. My research spans a broad spectrum of areas, including international trade, trade disputes, industrial policy, capacity building of FDI, RMG sectors (workplace environment and labor rights), and climate change impact on global trade. Methodologically, I predominantly utilize quantitative techniques, especially panel data analysis, to identify patterns and rigorously test theoretical frameworks, while also incorporating qualitative methodologies such as case studies and comparative analysis when appropriate.

Currently, I am contributing as a researcher to the CREATE project, funded by DANIDA and led by Aalborg University, Denmark, focusing on circular economy development in Bangladesh's apparel industry. I have published extensively in peer-reviewed international journals and have contributed chapters to academic volumes published by Routledge. I have led and participated in several research projects funded by renowned institutions including Oxfam UK, WFP, GIZ Germany, the University Grants Commission of Bangladesh, and the National Social Science Fund of China.
